The Pupil Premium is allocated to schools for every child who is currently entitled to Free School Meals, who had received Free Schools Meals within the last six years, who had been Looked After for a period of six months or more in the last six years or Service children. Schools can decide how to spend this funding, making additional provision for those children who require it.
