Safeguarding at St Paul's is embedded in all that we do and last term KS1 pupils attended a 'NSPCC— PANTS RULE' workshop. They learned how to keep their own bodies safe and what is classed as inappropriate/appropriate touching of others. The pupils were thoroughly engaged and reported that they had learned something new. Another workshop is timetabled for KS2 this half term. This term we would like to focus on providing families with information around neglect.

What is Neglect ?

Neglect comes under the category of abuse, together with sexual, emotional and physical abuse. The definition of neglect is the persistent failure to meet a child's basic physical and/or psychological needs, likely to result in the serious impairment of a child's health or development.

This can be seen as :

Persistent absence from school with no medical evidence - educational neglect.

Not providing adequate food, clothing, shelter once a child is born.

Failure to protect a child from physical/emotional harm or danger.

Failure to ensure adequate supervision.

Failure to ensure access to appropriate medical care or treatment.

It may also include neglect of or unresponsiveness to a child's basic emotional needs.
